How does it work?

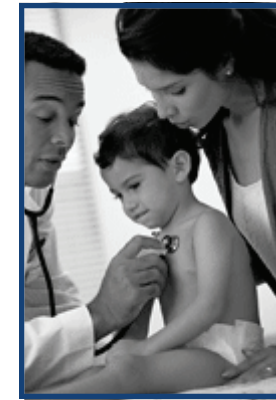
The NH Health Access Network:

- finds the financial assistance program you might qualify for;
- helps you apply for that program;
- gives you a NH Health Access Network ID card to get financial help throughout the state, if your application is approved.



How do I know if I qualify?

- If you do not have enough health insurance or enough money to pay for hospital care, doctor visits or other medical care, **and**
- If your monthly income and assets before taxes are less than \$1,805 (family of 1) or \$2,428 (family of 2), you might qualify.



Where do I go to apply?

- Your community hospital's patient billing office has applications.
- Your doctor's office might also participate. Please ask.
